

Dear Mr. Martin,

We are very disappointed that you did not even have the courtesy to contact us, the Residents' Association, with the outcome of the consultation even though you knew the hard work we had done to support your consultation by distributing twice 300 reminders to all the residents concerned. It is rather disgraceful that we learnt the results because I and several other residents have been contacted by the STEngagement team following letters written directly to the Stakeholder Engagement TfL. You had promised that after the discussion you had with LBB you would let us know how the Consultation went and the percentage of answers received for the different proposals.

As you may well imagine we are very distressed and shocked by your decision. You had told us earlier that you had a 30% answer to the consultation and that this was well above average. The STEngagement' letter informs us that **96% of people want a pedestrian crossing**. This means that an overwhelming number of residents want a pedestrian crossing. How can you defend your position of not giving us a crossing? As we have demanded and fought so hard for many years for a pedestrian crossing we have a right to know why this has been refused. Do we have to have some school children killed whilst crossing this exceedingly busy A232 before TfL agrees to put up a pedestrian crossing?

Obviously we are not happy to let the matter rest here. We are pursuing it by writing to our MP Mrs. Jacqui Lait and our GLC representative James Cleverly and are ready to take up the matter even further.
